Barbara will type up a list for the board regarding trees that may have been hit by the frost and may need an arborist's opinion on what we need to do. She also will list trees that have broken branches up high that may need to be trimmed by a professional.

We did what the board asked us to do in the villas to get ready for the fall painting. With the exception of villa 36. Things are looking good on our property.

If we get free mulch, we ask that the berm on Windrush Bay Drive be mulched first. Thank you.

Mary and I walked around the property the other day and found the following tree issues:

1. Behind building K (north side)—figus tree appears to be mostly dead and the rubber trees have several broken and hanging limbs.
2. North side of building H—cedars are not in great shape, especially the last tree on the far right. Looks like 2/3 of tree is dead.
3. East side of building F—broken hanging limb on tree behind dumpster.
4. Building G—top portion of large tree by parking lot is bare. We don't know if it will come back from the frost or not. Also, to the right of that tree is another that is bare. This could be normal but we don't know. Same situation with the tree diagonally across the street.
5. The palm tree behind villa 20 appears to be dead.

P.S. On a separate matter. You may know this already, but we spotted some rot on the shed of villa 11.
